

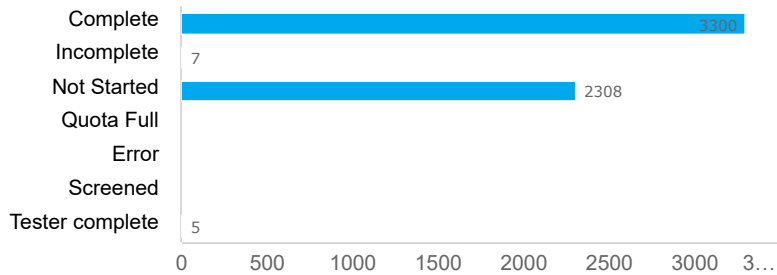

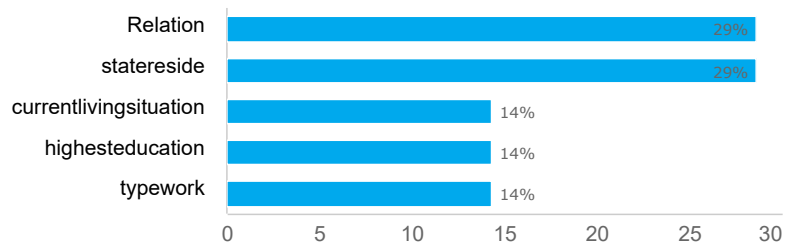
### Response status
